Annual = July-June. Methodology change - Before 2010, students self-identified by selecting only one option from the following categories: Hispanic/Latino, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian, Black/African American, White. As of 2010, students instead first identified themselves as to whether or not they were Hispanic/Latino, and then were able to further identify themselves in one or more of the following ethnic categories: American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian, Black/African American, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (new), White. The results are summarized according to the following hierarchy (per federal reporting requirements):

1. Nonresident Alien, aka International Students (regardless of whether or not other categories were selected)
2. Hispanic/Latino (regardless of whether or not other categories were selected)
3. Each of the five ethnic categories (if only one was chosen)
4. Two or more races (if more than one of the five individual categories was chosen)
